

WE HAVE AGREED TO PARTNER WITH THE OTTAUQUECHEE HEALTH CENTER TO OFFER **PROJECT DULCE**, AN INNOVATIVE INTERVENTION EMBEDDED WITHIN PEDIATRIC PRIMARY CARE, FOCUSED ON THE WELL-BEING OF NEWBORNS AND THEIR FAMILIES.

WE AIM TO SUPPORT AND ENGAGE WITH MORE PARENTS THROUGH THESE STRATEGIES. THESE COLLABORATIONS WILL ENABLE US TO REACH FAMILIES EARLIER IN THEIR CHILDREN'S LIVES.
